It is with great excitement that I can announce **"subscribe" comments on Drupal.org issues are now dead!** Long live issue following! Issue e-mail notifications are also improved.

Almost exactly 6 years after [#34496: \[meta\] Add Flag module to allow users to subscribe/unsubscribe without posting a comment](#) was originally posted, this feature is finally done and deployed on Drupal.org. If you notice any problems, please go to [#1306554: QA for issue following on Drupal.org](#) and comment there.

Summary of changes

In the past, you had to comment on an issue in order to keep track of it, commonly done by posting "subscribe" (or variations thereof). Popular issues gained plenty of such comments, making it hard for contributors to distill the important and useful information in an issue.

You are now able to "follow" issues by clicking a button, without commenting on them. You can also "unfollow" issues, even ones you had to comment on but you are not really interested in. Lastly, you can now configure for which projects and issues you want to get e-mail notifications.



Problem/Motivation

Communication is at the very center of everything we do as a community, and issue queues are the primary mechanism through which we communicate. However, the Drupal contributor community collectively loses **hours** of time each and every day in discussions, because there is no consistent way to find out what the current state is of any given non-trivial issue.

Once an issue hits about 20+ replies or so, a number of things start happening:

- Contributors not yet part of the discussion shy away from it because it's too intimidating. This dramatically reduces the number of people who can fix it.
- Where new contributors do wade in and get involved, they often just skip to the bottom of the discussion and start chiming in there, often repeating information that's already been hashed through 20 replies before. This is frustrating for all involved, and makes the issue even *longer* when this is pointed this out.
- Patch reviewers and committers both must read the entire issue top to bottom to understand what's happening. This dramatically increases the amount of time it takes to perform patch reviews and commits, leading to patch stagnation.
- Even in the rare cases that someone has taken it upon themselves to make an issue summary as one of the comments in the thread, the trick then becomes *finding* that issue summary in #99 of 128 comments, and trying to tell if it's still up to date given the other 10-15 replies below it.

This is fundamentally the **single biggest Drupal community performance issue**, and bites us absolutely everywhere, regardless if the problem trying to be solved is in core, contrib, or Drupal.org itself. Fixing it will make solving every *single* problem we solve thereafter (including improvements to how issue summaries are done) much, much easier.

Proposed resolution

Originally, the proposed fix was to flag one or more individual comments as an "Issue summary". However, this plan was abandoned for the following reasons:

1. In order to make a small correction/clarification to someone's issue summary, one has to re-copy someone else's comment and then paste it again. If someone else wants to make a small clarification to that, they have to re-copy and paste it again as well. This needlessly elongates the issue and makes it more sprawling and difficult to read and understand.
2. There's also no way to "diff" separate comments to see what was added or changed between revisions.
3. And finally, the infra team has nixed the proposal to deploy Flag module for comments due to the unacceptable performance hit on d.o (see [#60](#)).

Previous attempts have also involved a separate summary node, node-referenced to the issue, as well as a single "summary" field on an issue that's editable, but this too required putting new code on Drupal.org and thus got stalled.

Although there has been support for **distribution packaging** on Drupal.org since December 2009, there were many restrictions on what could be packaged for technical and legal reasons. By solving the underlying legal, technical, security, and usability problems, these restrictions have been lifted and fully-featured distributions are now enabled on Drupal.org! This move enables thousands of active developers to pursue distribution development with a consistent set of tools for managing version control, releases, issue tracking, collaboration, and documentation.

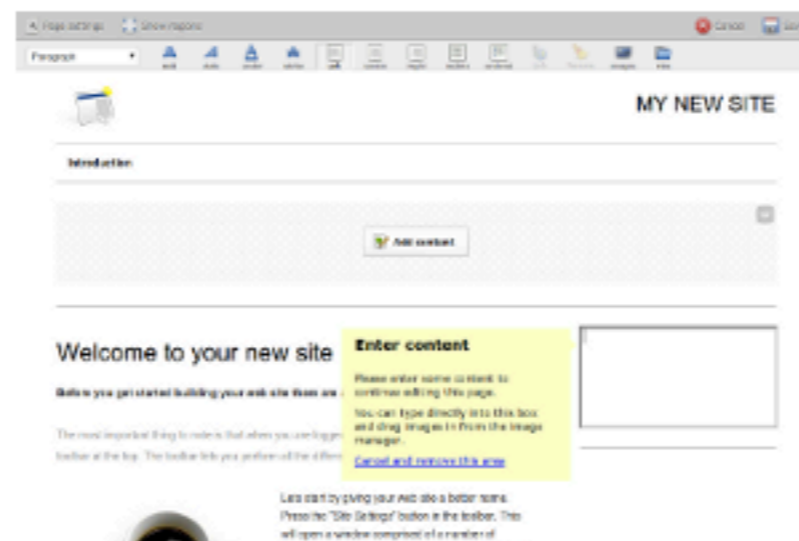

Drupal.org is our home. It's where we solve tough problems, it's where we innovate on creative solutions, and it's where we meet and interact with others in our community. It only makes sense then that our community should be able to actively participate in making improvements happen on Drupal.org, but the process to do so has traditionally been seen as a bit confusing and opaque.

This post attempts to outline the [process](#) of making changes to Drupal.org, and highlight some recent successes we've had putting this process into practice. This information is compiled from the [Make Drupal.org awesome guide!](#)

Step 1: Think it up

Have a great new idea for improving Drupal.org? Great! Search first, to see if someone else has already had your amazing idea and maybe started work on it. If not, begin by creating an issue in the [webmasters](#) issue queue to discuss, unless you happen to know the [appropriate issue queue](#) for it.

Prefer to collaborate on some ongoing efforts that other passionate people are working on? Check out the [Drupal.org improvements community initiatives page](#), and its various sub-pages, to join up with others on *their* big ideas. :)

Step 2: Talk it out

(Note that if you're participating in an *existing* issue that the Drupal.org maintainers have already signed off on, you can skip this step!)

At this stage, what you want to do is gather feedback from the rest of the community about your idea. Since Drupal.org is a shared resource

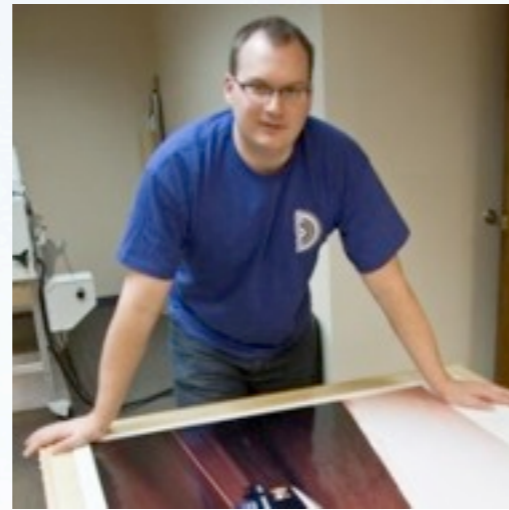


